Bethlehems, a nihilist group that call themselves "apocalypse doulas." Jenlena and her best friend Daphne are two aimless humanities grads in their early twenties living in a crumbling Montreal when the animals besiege cities and towns across the world, terrorizing their human residents. Though shocking, the threat is quickly neutralized when the animals are killed en masse for the safety of humanity. In the post-fauna world, Jenlena is transformed, shaking off her characteristic passivity to capitalize on other people's heartbreak and grief by selling plants that have come to replace pets, and impersonating dogs for pay. Conversely, Daphne, a once-promising student, flounders in a deep depression, smoking weed and slacking off at work to hang out with her canceled boyfriend.

Meanwhile, in California, the billionaire Roderick Maeve is paranoid, insecure, and listless after his most recent divorce. Desperate for public approval, he enlists a boy-genius to build a time machine that will return this chaotic world back to normal. When news of his plans breaks, Daphne is ecstatic, relieved that the world will be put to rights, restoring the possibility of the upper middle-class life she's always felt was promised to her, while Jenlena worries about what to do now that her newfound entrepreneurial ventures will no longer have value. Through a chance meeting at a hotel in downtown Montreal, Jenlena meets Maeve himself, and the two become romantically entangled; a relationship that will expose her to a new understanding of wealth, power, and what change really means. As the launch of the time machine nears and the Moon Bethlehems grow in number and influence, the world hurtles toward what might be destruction disguised as salvation, or perhaps the other way around.

Satirical, wry, and utterly original, MOOD SWINGS imagines with pitch-perfect absurdity what comes after life as we know it.

As their parents withdraw into themselves even further, Joanne continues to act out against the world she finds herself repelling more strongly against, facing extreme bouts of mental illness, while Bernadette wanders the city, buries her head in philosophy books, and somehow is able to hone her own voice as she approaches adulthood. After her worst breakdown yet, Joanne goes into exile in Deadhorse, Alaska, and it is up to Bernadette to find her and use all she's learned to revive a sense of hope against the backdrop of a failing world. Interlaced with allusions to Greek mythology, Shakespeare, Virginia Woolf, and Jane Austen, US FOOLS ambitiously layers in our collective preoccupations and obsessions in the Fareown sisters' search for a better future.

Daaji is the spiritual leader of Shri Ram Chandra, a meditation organization with 4 million practitioners in over 160 countries around the world. He is also fourth in line of raja yoga (which is known as "royal yoga"). His followers include the president of India, Ram Nath Kovind. While balancing his spiritual journey, Daaji was also a successful pharmacist in New York City, and is married with two sons. He currently resides in Hyderabad, India.
